## Engage the river the White River Way!

- Wear a life jacket** at all times when on the water.
- Navigate carefully**, being aware of hazards, dams, paddlers, and boaters.
- Be aware** of your surroundings and river conditions, including the potential for flooding.
- Touch the river with your feet**, not your face and be aware of water quality concerns.
- Be considerate** of people fishing and give them adequate space. When fishing, be sure to have a license and follow consumption guidelines.
- Be a good steward** by not littering, trespassing on private property, or disturbing wildlife or habitat. If you find litter, grab and dispose of it!

Known as the Waapikaminki to the Miami people who called Central Indiana home, and as the Wapahani to the Lenape tribe who settled along its banks as they were displaced westward, the White River has always served as the source of life for Central Indiana.
